NWST KAREN CAMPUS CONSTRUCTION

The construction of classrooms and multi-purpose hall is taking place simultaneously. The structures being constructed are four secondary classrooms, five pre-primary classrooms, nine primary classrooms, and four supporting toilet blocks.

These structures have been thoughtfully arranged in clusters across the site to preserve as many trees as possible and maintain a natural forest ambiance, creating a seamless integration with the environment.

The secondary and pre-primary clusters are more advanced in construction, with most roof structures completed and wall timber frames in progress. The primary classrooms are also at a roof structure level, except for one classroom, which is currently at the slab level due to an additional request.

Most of the electrical manholes and conduits are installed, and over half of the classrooms are already connected to electricity. The construction of two new septic tanks is underway, and they will eventually serve the new WC blocks. Multi-purpose hall construction began on June 12th. Similar to the classrooms, the hall's placement and design are carefully designed to respect and incorporate the existing native trees which the school is careful not to cut down. The workers are in the final stages of laying the foundations, and the slab is scheduled to be cast in the coming week.

The construction timeline for classrooms is estimated to be 16 weeks, while the multi-purpose hall is projected to take ten weeks. These timelines may have to be revisited due to some delays due to challenges with neighbours, weather conditions, and material procurement.

The Construction Committee is currently evaluating the tender package for Phase 2, which includes technical drawings, specifications, and cost estimates; it will serve as a baseline for negotiations with the contractor. The construction of this phase shall commence after the completion of the construction of classrooms and multi-purpose hall. It will consist of five additional classrooms (1 pre-primary and 4 primary) and other supporting facilities such as the Physics Lab, Library container, Sick Bay, Teachers' Room, Music Room, Workshop, and parking area.
