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
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Board Chair Message

Different Types of Child/ Individual Personalities.

Personality types are useful for recognising how we lead, influence, communicate, collaborate, negotiate business and manage stress.

here are four temperaments in a human being, and they radiate outwards to the world through a person's character. Sanguine, Melancholic, Choleric and Phlegmatic. Each temperament is different from the others. As the teacher gets to know children, they must understand their character and behaviour, mainly influenced by their temperaments.

We have four seasons in a year. They can be symbolic of the the four temperaments. The four elements earth, fire, water and air also are connected to these temperaments. As we mature, we strive to have each of them make us whole and balanced.

In Waldorf Schools, the curriculum helps the child to balance all four temperaments and control them.

Sanguine

These people are amicable, active, expressive, energetic, enthusiastic, social, bubbly and overly talkative. Due to their expressive nature, you can tell when they are angry or happy. Sanguines are popular in their surrounding. They tend to be people's favourites because they make them laugh because their sense of humour is very natural. The sanguines are like beautiful butterflies and cannot settle in one place; hence completing a task they have started is a tall order.

Sanguines are attention seekers, so they look for it if they do not get it. They love being with people. Although they are very caring, when imbalanced, they can be superficial. The yellow colour represents the sanguine. It is the spring colour, hence comparing the sanguines to the spring season. Their element is the air, light and moving around.

Melancholics

They are primarily slender and very tall. Their listening skills are good because they tend to feel deeply. They are very sympathetic and always look for ways to give out their support. Their inner life

is rich and are usually introverted. They are generally emotional. The blue colour is associated with melancholics due to its calm nature. The Autumn season and the earth element represent the melancholics. As children, they spend time playing quietly by themselves. When they are adults, they become deep thinkers and keep an eye on injustices. However, they can also be moody, discontent, obsessive, perfectionist, tunnel-minded, and pessimist.

Chorelics

Chorerics are very ambitious and confident people. They have leadership qualities, but they can be dictators if imbalanced. They are focussed on achieving their objectives and hence get things done. Physically they are full of energy and are always busy. They often look for challenges to keep their high energy engaged. The Colour red is associated with the cholerics, for they are fiery if imbalanced, especially when angry. The fire element in them makes them relate well to the summer season.

Phlegmatics

The colour associated with this temperament is green. The phlegmatics enjoy comfort and do not like change. They love food, whether eating or cooking. They are very wise and introverted. When pushed, they can be stubborn. Rhythm and routine are essential to them, and any change brings insecurities. The winter season and water elements represent phlegmatics.

We all have our differences. Each temperament has value to us. To work in harmony, we must recognise our differences and complement each other as we learn how to control and balance our characters.

NWST PAYMENT DISCOUNTS

We have several School Discounts that you can take advantage of. They are:

- a) 2.5% discount on school fees paid in full two weeks before the first day of school.
- b) 5% discount on annual school fees paid in full before the first day of school
- c) 10% sibling discount on school fees for additional (younger) children.
- d) If you refer a new parent to the school and they get enrolled your account will be credited with Ksh 5000 if they are in Kindergarten and Ksh 10,000 if they join primary.
